## 1st Quarter Report 2017

Greetings from St Joseph's College, Hongkong. Peace and Joy is within you.

I am writing this report at SJC Hongkong. I have been away from LSSC Changjiao since 22<sup>nd</sup> February. I went to the Philippines on 24<sup>th</sup> Feb to attend the Senior Brothers' Assembly and after the assembly I decided to stay back to have a cataract op done to my right eye at our De La Salle University Medical Centre at Dasmarinas. I was examined and told that the cataract was at stage 3 and an op procedure could be done. Thank God all went off well. I stayed at the Brothers' Residencia at DLSU-D after the op and while recuperating, I set about writing my book "PinPhonics: An Alternative Approach to Reading in English for Students in China". I am still working at it here and hopefully the first draft will be ready for proof reading and some translation into Chinese when I return to LSSC Changjiao after Easter.

As usual, the 1<sup>st</sup> Q report of LSSC Changjiao each year is mainly on the activities of the Winter English Reading Programme. This year, I left Malaysia for Hongkong early on 8<sup>th</sup> January so as to be able to return to LSSC Changjiao to prepare for the Winter Programme scheduled to begin on 16<sup>th</sup> January. Students helpers started checking in on 13<sup>th</sup> Jan to help with the registration of students on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> January. I no longer have a stay-in assistant and so I am completely dependant students staying in to assist me. Altogether there were 17 secondary and uni students (14 girls and 3 boys) staying in. I thank them for assisting me in running the programme and I enjoyed their company and their cooking skills. I also wish to thank villagers for giving us vegetables and parents for giving us cooking oil, rice, noodles, other provisions and a good supply of fruits.

We had 300 plus students and most were former students as I did not want to take in new students unless those applying to join were introduced by regular students who have been teaching them and they can fit in easily. I was very pleased with the classes especially the Class Two and Class Three students who showed great improvement in their reading skills and understanding of basic grammar skills. In fact when I introduced the "be" and "been" into into our 15 basic sentence structures Class Three students picked it up very fast and all of a sudden they realized that they could easily make 40 different sentences with the same Subject-Verb-Predicate. We had great fun making sentences in English and translating them into Chinese and Chinese sentences into English … with Chinglish turning up now and then. The more creative students were able to read short articles on screen and immediately re-read it is slightly different sentence structures. Thank God the 10 days of lessons went by very smoothly and safely.

The Winter programme ended on 25<sup>th</sup> January. The next day we slaughtered a 18 months old pig. The meat was beef-like coloured and there was little fat between the skin and meat. I had, since 2015, stopped giving meat to every family in Baijiang, so although the pig is just slightly over 200 kathies, I had enough to share with close family members and helpful friends in Dabu. I had 22 lunches and dinners this year and I left for Hongkong on 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb so that I could fly to Manila for the Senior Brother's Assembly on 24<sup>th</sup> Feb.

In my 1<sup>st</sup> Q report last year, I mentioned that building of the Catholic Cathedral in Mexian was more or less completed and that a Hongkong Lasallian had donated a beautiful mini-grand piano. At the end of last year I spoke to the Bishop about the necessity to install Biblical events stained glass windows. I met him again before I left for Manila in February and he assured me that it is possible after Easter a contract will be signed to begin installation work. The estimated price is between RMB 1.2 to 1.5 million. Those who are interested in making a donation please contact me. I promised to help raise the fund for this project.
